

REGULAR MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS ON MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 29, 2008 AT 5:15 P.M. AT CITY HALL. MEMBERS PRESENT: Chairman Bob Clary and Commissioner Dr. Marion Dwight. CLERK: Bruce Watson. VISITORS: Jerry Halmon and Will Martin.

Chairman Clary Called the meeting to order and Clerk Watson gave the invocation.

Commissioner Dwight made the motion to approve the minutes of the August 25, 2008 meeting as received. Chairman Clary made the second. All approved. The motion carried.

During the review of the Income and Expense Statements, Clerk Watson explained that BPW revenues exceeded expenses for the month of August by \$82,799.79. He said it seemed that the increase was mainly due to the increase in utility sales to Rockland Industries.

Will Martin reported that all was quiet with the BPW during the month.

The Income and Expense Statements were accepted as presented.

Commissioner Dwight informed the Commissioners that the legislators in Washington had turned down the economic improvement package today and the stock market had gone down 500 points.

Chairman Clary said the government had caused a lot of the problem by making questionable loans to individuals and then by not overseeing the loaning institutions.

During the questions from the press and audience, Jerry Halmon asked if the BPW was still doing business with the City of Denmark.

Chairman Clary explained that they were not serving water to Denmark at this time but that they would probably be calling again. Chairman Clary said the BPW was glad to help when they were needed.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 5:20 p.m.
